NEW TECHNOLOGY FOR BCS

Order after order, Bristol Consolidated School (BCS) is getting new exciting technology. Mr. Cough, the computer teacher at BCS, has been ordering mini robots called "Edware." The mini robots help the students learn about coding. Students have an app on their iPads that gives commands to the Edware robots. Mr. Cough gives the students a list of actions and commands to give to the robots, that make the robots move in the direction that the robot was commanded. The new technology at BCS is very exciting for the students and the staff!

Another exciting order is the new 3D printer! The 3D printer is made to print items from your device into a 3D design. The students use the app 123D design to create the 3D prints. So far Mr. Cough and some students have made a battery dispenser, a French horn, mini signs and bracelets.

The 3D printing starts with making a virtual design of the object you want to create. To get a 3D printer ready for printing, the 3D modeling breaks the final model into hundreds of layers. When the broken up file is uploaded in a 3D printer, the object is created layer by layer. The 3D printer reads every layer and creates the object, blending each layer so there are not any visible sign of the layers. The result is a three dimensional object. The possibilities are endless when it comes to the 3D printer!
